

How to Write & Submit a Letter to the Editor (LTE)

A Letter to the Editor, or LTE, is a brief statement meant to convey information or share an opinion. The goal is usually to effect change or activate readers to take action. LTEs are also an easy way to reach a local audience. This brief guide is intended to help you write strong LTEs in support of our sexual and reproductive health and rights.

Helpful Hints

- Be sure you know the word count allowed by the newspaper to which you're submitting (see pages 3-5 of this document). You don't want your letter to be rejected or to have the last sentences cut off. Most newspapers allow 200-250 words. This is usually around 2 paragraphs.
- If you're replying to an article printed in the same newspaper, your first sentence should refer to that story. **Example**: I don't agree with John Doe in his article, "Why I Hate Letters to the Editor," because...
- If you're *not* replying to another article in the same newspaper, the first sentence should either clearly state the topic you're writing on, or you can start by stating who you are and then state your topic. **Examples:**
 - 1. It's time to protect our families' healthcare records from government snooping. As someone who grew up in Montana, I know that privacy is a right that we all hold dear... **or**
 - 2. As a lifelong Montanan, a husband, and a father, I'm tired of extremist politicians interfering with my family's private medical decisions.
- Use values-based messaging. Readers will be more compelled if you're clear about your values and how they inform your position. Start with values, then follow with facts and data. Example: I think all Montanans should get to decide when and if they start a family. Our freedom of choice is part of what it means to live and thrive in the Big Sky state. That's why I support accessible abortion care.
- Be concise. Keep sentences short. Eliminate jargon and most big words. Examples:
 - 1. **Too wordy and academic:** Reflecting upon the discourse with regard to judicial independence, I've determined that I stand opposed to political interference in family healthcare decisions.



- 2. **Better:** Montanans want our judges to be fair and unbiased. That's why we need to keep extremist politicians out of our families' private medical choices.
- Close with a clear statement about the action you want readers to take. Example: I
 hope voters join me in learning the facts and voting for judges who will defend the
 Montana Constitution.
- Check spelling and grammar before you submit. Most newspapers do not edit LTEs.
- Email your LTE to the newspaper or submit via their online portal. Copy and paste your LTE into the body of an email. Do not send it as an attachment. Most newspapers won't open attachments from unknown senders.
- Wait 24 hours. Then call or email the newspaper and ask if your letter will be printed. If
 it won't, ask if there are changes you can make to get it printed. Listen to their feedback
 and determine if there are ways you can edit your LTE to be a better fit for the style or
 tone they typically accept.
